

### **Inventory of Collateral Consequences**



#### National Inventory of Collateral Consequences of Conviction (NICCC)

- Searchable online database of state and federal sanctions or restrictions that limit or prohibit people with criminal records from accessing employment, occupational licensing, housing, voting, education, and other opportunities.

#### **Employment-Related Consequences**




#### Include limits on:

- Business licensing and participation


### Impact on Health Care Employment
