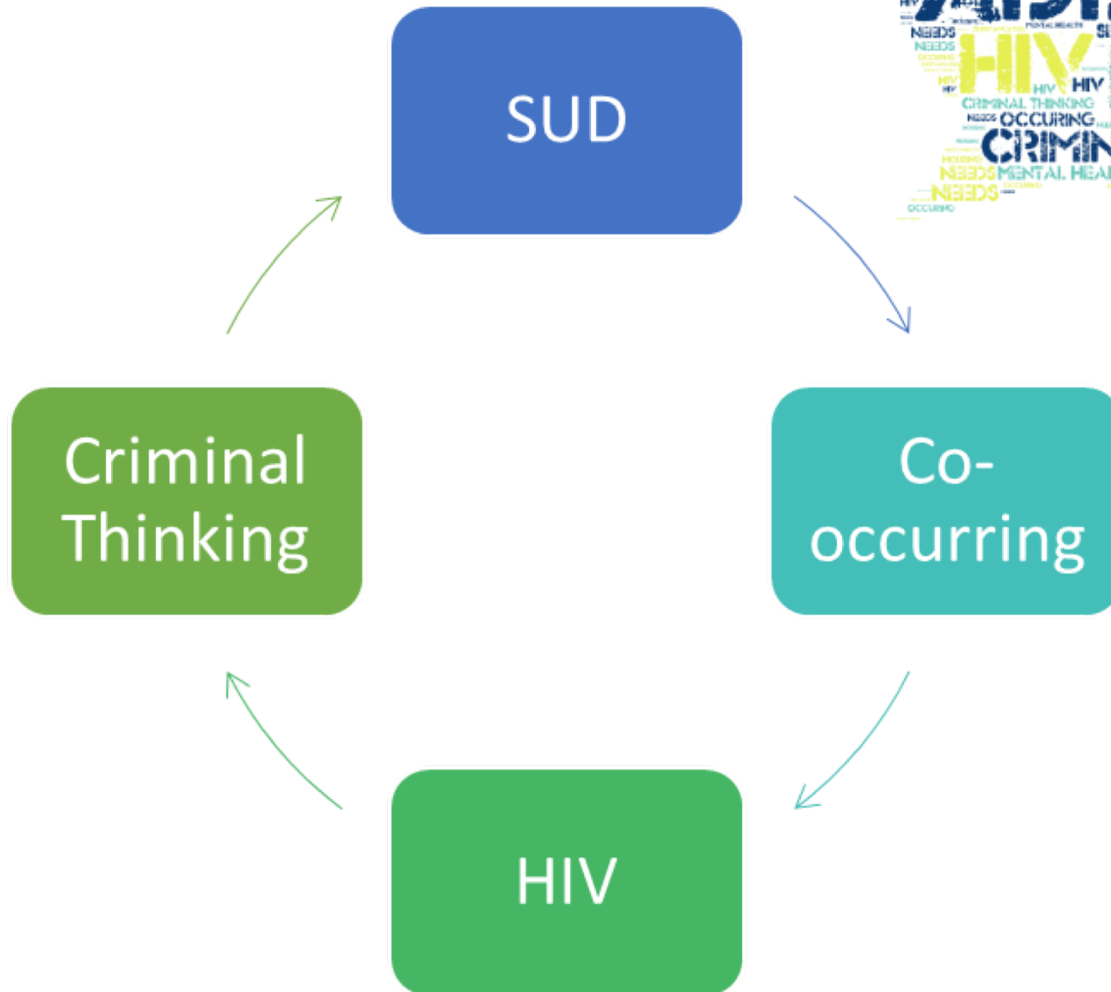
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Mission

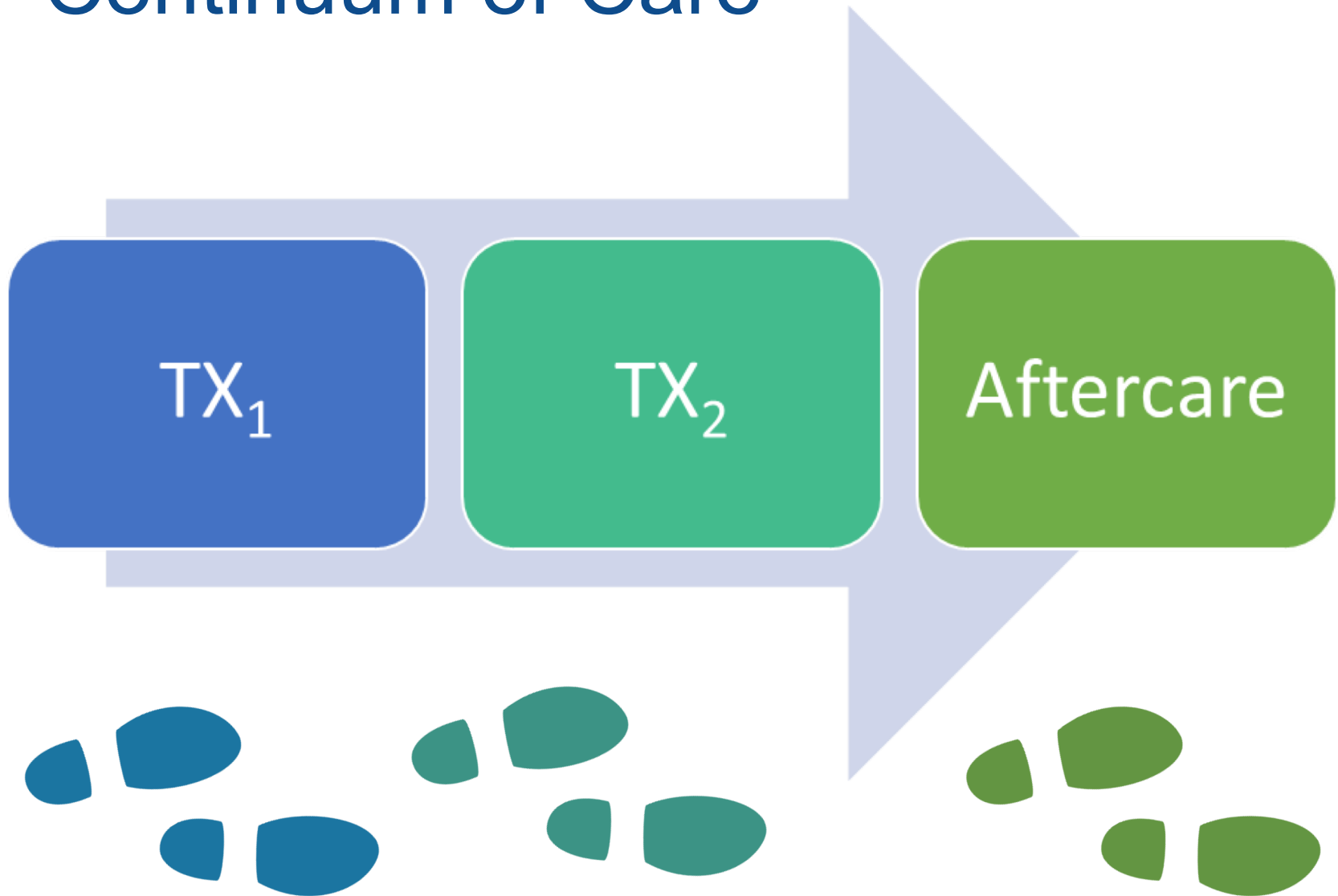
Sequencing



Sequencing

- Co-occurring conditions
 - SUD vs. MH
 - SUD vs. Criminal Thinking
- Multineed
 - Multiple Needs
 - Prioritize MH, SUD before Criminal Thinking
- Transition from treatment to social or vocational services
 - Treatment to other services

Continuum of Care



Continuum of Care

- Residential to IOP or OP
- OP to IOP or Residential
- Step up (step down)
- Focus on movement from treatment to recovery management services

Continuity of Care

- Transition to another program or service type
- Continue services to address other needs



Continuity of Care

- SUD followed by Education by Education
- Ensure treatment is followed by services that increase the social productivity of the individual
- Focus on stability
