






## Marion County Oregon Diversion from the Criminal Justice System and the Aid & Assist Docket




## Sequential Intercept






#### Marion County Jail Bookings

# Aid & Assist Docket (370)

- Participants:
  - Circuit Court Judge
  - Representatives from
    2 local Defense
    Offices
  - Representative from the District Attorneys Office
  - Representatives from Behavioral Health
  - Forensic Evaluator
- Process:
- Cases sent to DDA for Docket review list

- Docket members review case for mental health concerns and appropriateness
- Usually 2 slots for rapid evaluations, team agrees on who is referred from list
- Other considerations:
  - Civil Commitment
  - Community Restoration
  - Hospital Restoration
- Status Hearing for Community Restoration



Recidivism to the Jail within a calendar year

#### BRESA (Aid and Assist):

- **2015 52%; 2016 24%; 2017 18%; 2018 24%;**
- 2019 15%; as of 7/31/2020 7% and no returns between jail and OSH
- Jail Mental Health:
  - 2015 69%; 2016 48%; 2017 40%,
- BRESJ:
  - **2015 72%; 2016 52%; 2017 32%; 2018 45%**
  - 2019 35%; as of 7/31/2020 21%
