24/7 Mobile Crisis

ARP funding can help communities support collaborative crisis and early diversion responses to reduce criminal justice contact for people with behavioral health needs. The following opportunities can be leveraged to support the development of essential components (such as mobile crisis services) and infrastructure to help states and communities move beyond discrete crisis services to comprehensive, coordinated systems that include a continuum of crisis responses with connections to broader systems of care and supports.
