### What is the Office of Justice Programs?

- OJP is one of three grantmaking components of the Department of Justice along with the Office on Violence Against Women (OVW) and the Office of Community Oriented Policing Services (COPS).

## Purpose of the Improving Adult Education and Employment Outcomes Program

This program supports fair chance opportunities to **improve education and employment outcomes** for individuals currently incarcerated with 2 years or less before release into the community.

Fair chance opportunities refer to reentry services and programs designed to increase access to in-demand jobs and meaningful careers for justice-impacted people upon and following their release from incarceration.



## FY 2024 Funding Categories

- Category 1: Improving Reentry Education Outcomes
- Category 2: Improving Reentry Employment Outcomes



## FY 2024 Funding

- Estimated number of awards: Up to 10 in Category 1 and up to 12 in Category 2
- Maximum award amount: Up to \$900,000
- Performance duration: 36 months



## **Program Goal**



Opportunity reentry service and program that uses evidence-based interventions to reduce recidivism and promote success and well-being in individuals impacted by incarceration.



## **Program Objectives**



- ✓ Implement strategies that will commit to the overall educational or employment success.
- ✓ Create a career pathway system or a workforce development network .

Note: Category 2 applicants must commit to ensuring public safety by restricting internet access within incarcerated settings as deemed appropriate by the respective correctional agency.



## **Priority Areas**

#### Category 1A

 Meaningfully advance equity and remove barriers to accessing services and opportunities for communities that have been historically underserved, marginalized, adversely affected by inequality, and disproportionately impacted by crime, violence, and victimization.

#### Category 1B

• Demonstrate that their capabilities and competencies for implementing their proposed project(s) are enhanced because they (or at least one proposed subrecipient that will receive at least 40 percent of the requested award funding) are a population specific organization that serves communities that have been historically underserved, marginalized, adversely affected by inequality, and disproportionately impacted by crime, violence, and victimization.



## **Priority Areas**

#### Category 2

- Provide an assessment of local demand for employees in the geographic areas to which incarcerated individuals are likely to return as well as provide jobtraining grants that look at the local labor/job markets in communities where individuals leaving incarceration are returning.
- Conduct individualized reentry career planning upon the start of incarceration or post release employment planning for each individual served under the grant.
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- Demonstrate connections to employers within the local community.
- Track and monitor employment outcomes.



## **Examples of Potential Programs**(Existing Grantees)

Use tablet-based technology platforms and services to increase educational and vocational programming capacity in a jail environment.

Incorporate reentry services and related skills-training in prison-based education programming.

Provide comprehensive reentry services to high-risk men to address trauma and improve employment and other outcomes.



## Eligible Applicants

State governments, special district governments, city or township governments, county governments, Native American Tribal governments (federally recognized)

Nonprofits having a 501(c)(3) status with the IRS, other than institutions of higher education

Nonprofits that do not have a 501(c)(3) status with the IRS, other than institutions of higher education.



## **Application Requirements**

Disclosure of Lobbying Activities (SF-LLL)

Proposal Abstract
Proposal Narrative
Budget Detail and Budget Narrative (Web-based Form)
Application for Federal Assistance (SF-424)

## **Proposal Abstract**

Include a summary of the purpose of the project, primary activities, expected outcomes, the service area, known intended beneficiaries, and subrecipients.

Write it in the third person for a public audience, as it will be publicly available on the OJP website if the project is awarded.

## **Grantee Deliverables**

- ✓ An action plan consisting of strategies and key indicators that would potentially revise milestones for this award. The assigned technical assistance provider will supply the action plan and assist grantees to complete it.
- ✓ A final report at the end of the project period.





### **Review Criteria**

Applications that meet the basic minimum requirements will be evaluated by peer reviewers on:

Statement of the Problem/Description of the Issue (15%) Project Design and Implementation (35%) Capabilities and Competencies (30%) Plan for Data Collection Required for Performance Measures (10%) **Budget (10%)**

#### ▲ SAM.gov Entity Validation Update ℰ

GSA implemented a new process to validate an entity's legal business name and physical address when requesting a Unique Entity Identifier (UEI) and for completing a SAM.gov entity registration. Due to a high volume of requests, entity validations are taking longer than expected to process. This validation process is now taking 7-10 business days, and in some cases longer.

OJP strongly recommends starting your SAM.gov registration process as soon as possible to allow the time necessary to process entity validations well in advance of the Grants.gov due date posted in the solicitation. Read this FAQ for more information.

The Office of Justice Programs (OJP) Grant Application Resource Guide ("Guide") provides guidance to assist OJP grant applicants in preparing and submitting applications for OJP funding. It addresses a variety of policies, statutes, and regulations that apply to many (or in some cases, all) OJP program applicants, or to grants and cooperative agreements awarded in fiscal year (FY) 2023. Some OJP programs may have program solicitations that expressly modify a provision of this Guide; in such cases, the applicant is to follow the guidelines in the solicitation as to any such expressly modified provision.



NOTE: Submission deadline times for both Grants.gov and JustGrants are 8:59 p.m. ET
