Explains why the proposed law enforcement response will achieve the desired outcome. Provides a rationale for the response and details key assumptions.	Lists the essential, tangible, and intangible requirements necessary to engage in the activities of the law enforcement response.	Describes what activities will need to take place to achieve the expected outcomes.	Includes the discrete measures to showcase that the law enforcement response is working as intended, including potential outputs of the proposed activities.	Demonstrates the measurable changes that can be expected because of the law enforcement response. Outcomes usually require following people for a period of time after the response has been completed.
